



2022 Program Accomplishments & Results

Help and encourage children and youth to succeed

- 16 school age children and their families participated in summer enrichment programs that incorporated literacy, STEM concepts, nature, and community engagement
- 113 preschool age children demonstrated improved literacy skills and school readiness
- 135 children ate over 14,000 nutritious meals and snacks throughout the Head Start “school” year
- 150 preschool and school age children received essential items to include personal hygiene and clothing
- 200 plus bilingual books were distributed to preschoolers, school aged children and adults including titles commemorating Juneteenth

Support people who are working or entering the workforce

- 17 adults participated in English as Additional Language (EAL) classes – 10 individuals demonstrated improved language skills
- 20 individuals received assistance with transportation related needs
- 150 individuals and families increased their savings
- 214 individuals and families increased their income through state and federal income tax credits

Support people facing crisis

- 10 people received assistance with emergency clothing related needs
- 27 permanent supportive housing opportunities for individuals and families who were homeless were maintained
- 42 families avoided evictions
- 46 families obtained safe & affordable housing
- 106 families received emergency home energy assistance
- 111 different people received emergency food boxes
- 500+ individuals received COVID 19 personal protective equipment, home test kits, and hand sanitizer

Strengthen the whole family

- 10 families received the necessary technology supplies, instruction and services to support remote learning for their children and themselves
- 69 families participated in on line or in person parent education/engagement workshops
- 97 families improved the health and safety of their homes
- 472 families reduced their home energy burden
